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Principal's Message

Dear Families,

This week your children will receive their reports for Term 1. What an excellent time to sit down and have a conversation with your child. Ask them what they like about school, what they find challenging and where they think they might be able to improve or work harder? What are they proud of? What would they like to see change?

It is also a wonderful time to set goals with your children. Review your expectations for them. Have them tell you what they like to work on and what they might need your help with. Some helpful tips include: setting a regular routine for homework and keeping to a regular bedtime routine. Sleep and nutrition are direct influences on a child's ability to learn. This might also mean the family sits together at the kitchen table while everyone works on something, and the TV and video games are off. The latest research shows how detrimental too much screen time is for all of us but especially harmful to children and their developing brains as well as being distracting to us as parents. Consider a time where everyone puts down their phones, devices or other technology.

Regular attendance at school is very important - a student's overall growth increases significantly over time when they attend regularly/on time and have strong connections to all aspects of classroom and school learning. Research demonstrates there is a powerful link between successful learning and regular school attendance.

WORKING TOGETHER IN THE PARKING LOT

Student safety is a priority for all of us at St. Mary's School. Our school buses bring over 85% of our students to school. They drop students off from 8:35-8:50 as well as come to pick them up at the end of the day. We all have to work together to ensure the safety of students walking in the parking lot onto the school yard or as they board/offload from their bus.

Parents <u>MUST NOT</u> park and exit their vehicle in our student drop off/pick up area. There is <u>no parking in the respective traffic/bus lanes</u>. If you wish to walk your child onto our school yard, you must park your car in the designated parking area. Please wait for buses to load/unload and leave prior to moving your vehicle.

Please extend co-operation and courtesy when you need to use the parking lot. As our parking lot is used by our school buses, parents and church goers, please note that it is also vitally important that speed limits are maintained for safety in the parking lot.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

What does this mean for families when there is inclement weather.

- when transportation is cancelled in ZONE 2 due to inclement weather and road conditions, schools and school facilities
 are closed to students and staff. Asynchronous learning activities will be provided via Brightspace
- when transportation is cancelled due to extreme cold weather which makes the operation of busses difficult and the
 wait times for students for the bus problematic. In this situation, schools and school facilities would <u>remain open to</u>
 staff and students.
